Vulnerable Groups:

The College recognises those students who have specific needs and will tailor any CEIAG provision accordingly. Staff dealing with these groups work closely with the College CEIAG lead and external agencies to ensure every student is provided with the support they need in way they can understand.

Pupil Premium, SEN and Free School Meal students have access to and will be provided with additional careers advice to raise aspirations, motivation and attainment and reduce the chance of NEET (Not in Employment Education or Training). This will be through enhanced transition, individual support sessions at key stages Option Choices, as well as selected employer engagement activity.
